An accomplished sailor and successful author, Jimmy Cornell has sailed 200,000 miles in all oceans of the world including three circumnavigations as well as voyages to Antarctica, Alaska and Spitsbergen. Thousands of sailors have fulfilled their dream of blue water cruising with the help of Jimmy Cornell's books, among them the bestseller *World Cruising Route*. With 150,000 copies sold to date, this is one of the best selling nautical publications in the world. Most of Jimmy's 14 books have been translated into several languages.

As the founder of the highly successful ARC transatlantic rally, Jimmy Cornell is credited with having devised the offshore cruising rally concept. Now in its 25<sup>th</sup> year, the ARC continues to be the largest, and most popular, transocean sailing event in the world. Until his retirement from running sailing events in 2000 Jimmy Cornell had organized 24 transatlantic rallies, five round the world rallies and one round the world race, with over 3,000 boats and 15,000 sailors having participated in his sailing events.
